Welfare and Safeguarding Update



As I am sure you can imagine, there has been a significant increase in focus on safeguarding for children at the Football Association within the past 6 months. There has, quite rightly, been a tightening of controls and enhanced focus on ensuring that all volunteers have the appropriate qualifications and checks.

During this time, we have had to attest to confirm that all coaches and volunteers are accredited and that all members of the Executive Committee have completed a specific online education course, without which we are unable to apply for affiliation of Cheshire FA. The purpose of these measures is to ensure that standards of welfare are consistent across all clubs, and that all children are playing in a safe environment.

In March each year we are audited by Cheshire FA and, as in previous years, this audit was successfully passed without any additional actions required. For this, I would like to thank all volunteers who respond so well to my requests to attend courses and update their CRC checks. With over 90 coaches now in the club, its a big job and its made easier when everyone helps.

Earlier this year as part of the Nike Partner arrangement the club were offered a Nike coach led training session.

After one failed attempt (when the coaches mistakenly almost went to Upton in East London!) both of the under 16 squads, Blues and Blacks had a joint training session taken by two Nike Partner Club coaches Jon and Dan. Over 30 players attended the session held at EPSV and all of the lads tried on Nike Footwear for the session which arrived in two very smart Nike branded vans full of very expensive footwear (and expensive Nike match balls which Dave Wilde tried and failed to steal!).

The session went very well, with all the lads engaged for the whole hour and it ended with an evenly fought 11 a side game. Jon and Dan spoke very highly of the lads at the end and said they were a credit to the club and their coaches and the feedback received from the lads afterwards was all positive.

Jon and Dan were very open about why Nike do this - describing it as 'soft sell' encouraging the choice of Nike footwear the next time players look to replace their boots in what is a very competitive market (Adidas being their main rival), but this did not affect the enjoyment of the session by all who took part. Jon and Dan said they would be happy to visit again to offer further sessions.
